The Georgia Pavement Preservation Council (GPPC), organized in 2026, is comprised of contractors, suppliers, consultants, local government officials, and academia. The purpose of the GPPC is to support education and advance outreach assistance to local agencies throughout Georgia for pavement preservation and asset management. The National Center for Pavement Preservation (NCP) has partnered with the GPPC to champion our effort in Georgia. The NCP is a non-profit, quasi-government organization recognized nationally as the leader in pavement preservation. The NCP administers the AASHTO Preservation Management Technical Services Program and is actively engaged with the FHWA Office of Asset Management. NCP is an authorized provider of continuing education credits.

Background

Members of the pavement preservation industry recognized the need to offer a neutral and productive environment for pavement preservation and asset management education in Georgia. They approached the National Center for Pavement Preservation (NCP) about organizing an educational outreach initiative for local agencies. This outreach is a dedicated initiative within the United States to focus pavement preservation educational efforts at the local government agencies. The Georgia Pavement Preservation Council (GPPC) was formed to provide financial resources to advance this effort within the State of Georgia. Bradley Klinger is the coordinator for the state of Georgia. The experience that Bradley possess will help focus training on the immediate pavement preservation needs of the county and municipal government agency.
