What is the Cold In-place Recycling Climate Initiative?

The Cold In-place Recycling (CIR) Climate Initiative Outreach Program was organized to showcase a proven road preservation process that greatly reduces greenhouse gas emissions over traditional construction and rehabilitation methods. A short workshop session provides an excellent opportunity for Bay Area local road officials to learn about the financial and environmental benefits of in-place recycling from national experts. This outreach program offers an occasion to witness an ongoing project in Napa to better understand the CIR process. It will provide a forum where local jurisdictions can discuss and learn how to replicate a climate initiative in their agency.

When and where will the outreach program be held?

The workshop and field demonstration was specifically designed for Public Works Directors, City & County Elected Officials, and key staff involved with decision-making of maintenance strategies.
