# BACKGROUND

## Local Agency Issues

- Limited funding available
- Lack of knowledge about pavement preservation concepts, candidate selections, and treatments
- Elected officials limit the use of preservation treatments due to bad experiences and citizen concerns
- Portions of local road network is not suitable for pavement preservation (i.e.; poor base)
- Favor “performance based” specifications to strengthen low bid process and want to be part of development process

# BACKGROUND

## Formation

- Presented to NCPP Advisory Board - February 2010
- Approved FPPC to begin operation under NCPP auspices
- Continue the Florida education process started by Jim Sorenson, FHWA
- Recognized continual need for pavement preservation education to local agencies
- Traditional education programs not reaching local agencies for a variety of reasons
- Important to accomplish education in a non-marketing environment by a neutral party

# COUNCIL CHARTER & CENTER PARTNERSHIP

## Mission

- “Raise the Bar” for pavement preservation state of practice in Florida through education
- Conduct workshops on pavement preservation concepts, management, and the “tool box”
- Demonstrate ethics of honesty, integrity, dedication, inclusiveness, and highly developed competency

## Council Goals

- Promote pavement preservation principles through training and education in Florida
- Provide NCPP conducted pavement preservation workshops
- Provide regional specifications and guidelines for pavement preservation techniques in Florida
